Informal Discussion Meeting – Invitation to Leaseholders

External Refurbishment and Garage Works

Phase 1 of the external refurbishment has concluded with very positive feedback from affected residents and leaseholders.

Phase 2: Rosewood Limited, who provided very good quality work on Phase 1, also submitted the most competitive tender for Phase 2 and have been appointed and the work will start shortly, beginning with Selwyn House. Residents of the affected Houses (Selwyn, Glenalmond, Girton, Balliol and Harvard) have been informed.

Glenalmond Garages

Works are almost completed despite some delays along the way. This was never a simple project but the Phase 1 replacement contractors, UK Gunite, have provided a quality service finalising the roof renewal and, subsequently as Phase 2 contractors, addressing the concrete spalling in the interior areas. Some final "snagging" issues are in progress.

And then the bees:

Our bees hope to return sometime during or before the spring and a little access area has been created for them and our lovely bee keeper – Steve Derry - who provides the Manor Fields honey on a non-profit basis.

Residents Parking Permits

Annual resident permits are currently being issued. We remind you that permits are available only to actual residents. Manor Fields does not provide a parking facility for non-residents or residents' friends. Permits are not transferable. Temporary permits for residents' guests are available from the Estate Office.

Good Neighbours

We would like to remind you of the following:

- Car-owners/drivers: Please park "economically" in the spaces available to maximise spaces for other residents and not on corners which block visibility for other drivers and pedestrians;
- **Please drive slowly**; we have many young families on our estate. The speed limit is 15 mph.
- All residents: Please arrange home deliveries within sociable hours as a courtesy to your neighbours. Deliveries should not be booked before 9am and after 10pm.
- Waste disposal: A recent drain blockage resulted in three black plastic sacks of wet
 wipes and other items being removed from the back-road drains of several Houses.
 This creates a totally avoidable inconvenience to ground floor neighbours when a reflux
 occurs into their flat as well as an avoidable expense to leaseholders who bear the
 service charge costs. Please do not dispose of anything other than human waste and
 toilet paper down your toilets.
